



NCCMI AT A GLANCE 2017-2018

Mission: Achieving Excellence Through Musical Performance

NCCMI provides mentorship and chamber music education primarily to young people, aged 7-18. Students work together to present an outstanding performance of masterworks for small ensembles and develop a life-long love of chamber music. Faculty includes North Carolina Symphony musicians and other leading teachers. Groups share their music with the community through outreach events. Financial Aid is available for families who are unable to pay the tuition.

By the Numbers:

- 64 Students in 2017-18 NCCMI program
- 20 or more performances in the Community
- 5 master classes/workshops
- 17 small ensembles (12 string ensembles, 4 piano/strings and 1 woodwind quintet)
- 21 teachers (including NCS members, college professors and other outstanding community teachers)

Where and when do groups meet for coaching sessions and concerts?

Students are matched in groups, based on their schedule availability. Groups commit to their specific day and time. Groups choose their events out of the list of multiple NCCMI choices. They meet at churches or students' homes for sessions.

Required curriculum for Students:

- 2 Concerts
- 1 Outreach Performance
- 1 Master Class or Workshop

Performance Review and Final Awards Concert- Open to students and the general public!

In January, groups participate in a **Performance Review** for the NCCMI faculty and their student peers, receiving feedback and scores to focus their spring semester work.

Final Concerts take place in April. Students present their repertoire in a formal concert followed by an awards presentation. April 29 and 30.
